After 11 years as head of the Brussels office, Claude Chanson has decided to step down as Director General. He will continue working in the battery sector and for the association mainly as an advisor and to ensure a smooth transition with the future replacement.

Patrick de Metz, Chairman of the Board, said "Under Claude Chanson's tenure, RECHARGE has become a key organisation in the rechargeable batteries sector, putting the interest of the industry at the forefront of the EU agenda. The new Director General will have to build on the legacy but also to seize the opportunity of the new EU Commission and European Parliament to give a new impetus and defend the interest of an innovative sector which will be key to deliver on the EU's green agenda and the planet's future. The EU needs to be bold to maintain high investment and quality jobs to become a global leader in battery technologies."

Claude Chanson stated: "It was an honour to lead the organisation throughout these years. RECHARGE with the support of my team and the members, is now a well-recognised organisation in the world of batteries, standard bodies and policy makers. I am proud of these achievements. With the new policy cycle coming up it is time for me to concentrate on other missions".

RECHARGE has appointed <u>MAVENCE</u>, a public affairs recruitment agency, to lead on the recruitment of a new Director General. The process will be done in coordination with the Members of the Board and aims to be completed before the end of this semester.
